No to Option A

Close to the current bridge and tunnels, this option will increase the number of lanes crossing the Thames and squeezing back into the four lanes of motorway.



No to Option B

Through Grays Beach Park and Tilbury Docks before passing between Thurrock Park's homes and ASDA, Tilbury, to the Dock Approach Road.



No to Option C

Powering between Coalhouse and Tilbury forts, this link will pass close to East and West Tilbury, Chadwell, Orsett Heath, Orsett, Bulphan and South Ockendon to the M25.

Some of the arguments from residents and stakeholders that you could use in your response.

- Thurrock needs investment now to reflect the growth agenda already happening in the borough.
- There needs to be time to consider the impact of freeflow tolling and full investment in junction 30 and 31 of the M25 before any consideration of a new crossing.
- Other options east of Thurrock, considered in 2009, have been too readily discounted from this consultation and should be put back on the table.
- The three options do not offer value for money and are considerably lower compared to other national infrastructure projects.
- The options, particularly option C create an environmental disaster in the borough, one of the most interesting and diverse biodiversity locations in the country.
