

PUBLIC NOTICE

TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER

The Borough of Thurrock (Corringham and Fobbing) (No Waiting At Any Time) Order 2019

- 1) Notice is hereby given that Thurrock Borough Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1, 2, 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby gives notice that they have made the above order on the 5th September 2019, the order will come in to force on the 7th October 2019.
- 2) The general effect of the Order would be:-
 - a) To introduce new waiting restrictions "No Waiting at Any Time" at the following locations;
 - I. On the north-western side of Fobbing Road, from a point opposite the eastern flank wall of 36 Fobbing Road north-eastward to a point opposite the common boundary of 42 & 44 Fobbing Road.
 - II. On both sides of Beechcombe, extend existing double yellow lines at junction with Digby Road southwards to the common boundary of 1 & 3 Beechcombe.
 - III. At the junction of Kersbrooke Way and Fernside Close.
 - IV. At the junction of Kersbrooke Way and Elmstead Close
 - V. At the junction of Kersbrooke Way and Kenwood Road.
 - VI. On the north-eastern side of Lampits Hill, from the common boundary of 68 & 70 Lampits Hill Road south-eastward to the southern flank wall of 64 Lampits Hill.
 - b) To revoke waiting restrictions "No Waiting Mon-Sat 8am-6pm" at the following locations;
 - i. On the north-eastern side of Lampits Hill, from the common boundary of 68 & 70 Lampits Hill Road south-eastward to the southern flank wall of 64 Lampits Hill.
- 3) A copy of the Made Order together with the plans will be available for inspection for a period of 21 days at the Civic Offices, New Road, Grays, RM17 6SL during normal office hours and also on Thurrock Council's website at thurrock.gov.uk/publicnotices
- 4) Any person wishing to object to the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act, or that any requirements of the Act has not been complied with, may, within 6 weeks from the date of on which the order is made apply for the purpose to the High Court.
